

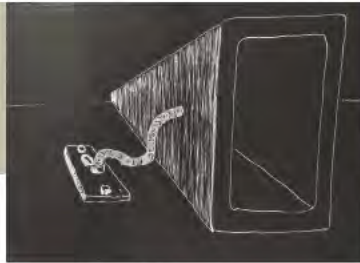
A change of direction

A new environment will continue to inspire art visitors.

After 40 years abroad, Kerikeri gallerist Julia Reinholt returned to New Zealand in 1999. Having qualified as a teacher in London, Reinholt's most memorable jobs include teaching at the Vienna International School, helping set up kindergartens for Palestinian refugees in Syria, and opening a preschool for expatriate and local children in Damascus.

Reinholt has always loved the arts, and as a keen photographer and painter, she set up a studio at home in Kerikeri and there Kaan Zamaan was born. As the number of artists she represented grew, Kaan Zamaan expanded, relocating three times in the following sixteen years. The gallery in the Kerikeri town centre is now closed and Reinholt has reopened her original home studio. "It is a blessing really, and time to downsize and change direction" she says.

In a beautiful historic location overlooking Koraripo Pā and the Kerikeri basin, the new gallery space will present a personal and intimate environment for looking at art. The new space will host exhibitions and workshops and

The first exhibition, will be *Suspect Devices* opening in December, with new work by Scott McFarlane and Bernard Winkels. Screening



at the opening will be a video work titled *Where the Sun Goes Down* by McFarlane, Hamish MacLean, Kelly Michael and Jason Taylor. This work is currently representing New Zealand at the Bienal de Curitiba, Brazil, until 25 February.
